Dear Principals and Teachers,

The Illinois & Michigan Canal National Heritage Corridor Civic Center Authority extends this invitation to you and your students to attend our "School Day" as part of *A River Thru History - the Des Plaines Valley Rendezvous*, at the Forest Preserves of Cook County's Columbia Woods in Willow Springs. This is our 26<sup>th</sup> Rendezvous. **"School Day" is Friday, September 9, 2016 from 9:30am to 2:00pm** (schools may stay an hour or so later if they like, however re-enactor camps will begin to close at 2pm).

*A River Thru History – the Des Plaines Valley Rendezvous* is a "living history" re-enactment of an event that would have occurred along the Des Plaines River prior to 1848. The Rendezvous participants are in historically accurate clothing and shelters. We expect to have about forty encampments and demonstrators. The students, parents and teachers will be immersed in a rich discussion of history, social customs, and the skills and items that were necessary to survive on the frontier. The time period we encompass with the Rendezvous is from the period of early exploration, through the fur-trade era, to the early colonization of our area, approximately 1660 to 1848. This material is appropriate for most **4th, 5th and 6th grade classes** studying American and local history. Our capacity is limited, so participation in "School Day" is by invitation only. We continue to direct our focus toward making this a truly educational event.

If your school plans to participate in the Rendezvous School Day, **please fill out the attached form and if possible, return it before July 1, 2016**. Space is somewhat limited because of the physical limitations of the encampment. **Therefore, reservations will be on a first received, first reserved basis (we often don't fill up so please send even if after July 1)**. Once your school is registered, we will send you a confirmation letter with additional information.

**It's Free - there is no fee this year!** In addition, each student will be given one free "student" pass so that they may return with their families on Saturday, Sept. 10<sup>th</sup> or Sunday, Sept. 11<sup>th</sup> when the Rendezvous is open to the general public.

1. Attendance is limited. Reservations are accepted on a "first come - first served" basis.

5. Arrival and departure should be **by BUS only**. The logistics of School Day and the site prohibit the use of personal vehicles. Parents and chaperones must be on the bus.

In most cases, lunch with a drink will be less than \$7. Please note that only period correct drinks are available such as lemonade, ice tea, cider, cocoa, root beer, coffee, etc.

## SPECIAL INVITATION TO EDUCATORS:

After *School Day* ends on Friday the event will open to the general public for the weekend – Saturday, September 10, and Sunday, September 11, 2016!

Even if your school chooses not to participate in a field trip during school day on Friday, we invite each of you to attend with your family/friends on Saturday September 10 and Sunday September 11, 2016. The Event is held at Columbia Woods in Willow Springs. Access is by Free Shuttle only. Please plan to park at the UPS service lot at 75<sup>th</sup> Street and Willow Springs Road.

You can scope out the Rendezvous for your school for future years, or just attend and enjoy this unique cultural event. Although the event spans a wide time frame, we try to maintain historical accuracy while providing good “period correct” food and great entertainment!

The location of the event, on the banks of the Des Plaines River in Columbia Woods, was chosen to look like an actual Rendezvous encampment that could have been held annually in this same area prior to 1848. If you’re lucky you’ll be standing next to the river when voyageur canoes land and unload their goods for trading at the Rendezvous. We have several cannoneers that liven things up from time to time with cannon firing demonstrations. And then there is Andy (“Andre”) Talley, French Voyageur and “story teller”, who finds a crowd and starts weaving together a tale that kids love and you can’t walk away from. Learn how the bear lost his tail. Hear the amazing story of a frontier hunter who gets sleepy and what happens to him. Learn history first hand by talking to Jean Baptist Du Sable (Chicago's first resident). If you happen to see him wandering around the camp he will tell you how he came to the Chicago area from Haiti to seek his fortune as a merchant trader. You and your family will actually feel like they met the “real” Du Sable.

There is a small entry fee to cover the costs of running the event, but I think you will find it is well worth it.
